**Topic**: Relevant area discussed in class. Format of the review paper: Introduction. Research

Methods, Results, Discussion, and Conclusions Reference Cited.

Paper is due to Dr. Prakash by April 1. Total Grade: 30%.

OR

**RESEARCH GRANT PROPOSAL**: The subject choice is due by March 1.

<u>Details</u>: Follow the Canadian Institute of Health Research (CIHR) guidelines. You are requested to submit complete CIHR research module and budget modules (Except CV modules and detail budget justification). Grant Proposal is due to Dr. Prakash by **April 1**. Total Grade: *30%*.
